### WHO WE ARE

Members of the coalition are health care and substance use specialists, faith community representatives, business representatives and homebuilders, community organizers and people with lived experience.

We share a strong belief that in a city as prosperous and caring as Guelph, no one should be sleeping in a tent and that a community-led pilot is a fast and effective way to house individuals while longer-term housing options are being developed.

## WHAT WE ARE PROPOSING

- A Tiny Home Pilot Community of 25-50 homes for people currently unhoused to support stabilization while longer-term housing options are developed in our community.

- The pilot community will be supported 24/7 by a team of volunteers and staff and will include healthcare services and additional supports as needed/identified by the residents.

- The goal of this pilot will be to help the people who have fallen through the gaps in our system to have a safe housing option, and support them through the next step of their housing journey.

- This model has been implemented in other communities across Canada (Kitchener, Peterborough, Fredericton) and is proven to be an effective high-speed, low-cost housing option.

- Our goal is to have the community area and tiny homes built by winter 24/25.

## **KEY GOALS**

1. To identify the best location in the City of Guelph for a Tiny Home Community to meet the needs of its unhoused community members.

2. To develop a site plan and seek approvals for a tiny home community on the preferred site. 3. To develop partnerships and leverage community and business resources to build a tiny home community before the Winter of 2024/25.

4. To deliver a community-led model for building and maintaining a Tiny Home Community that is cost effective and person-centered.

## WHAT WE HAVE DONE SINCE JANUARY, 2024

- Drafted a Project Charter to clearly communicate how this project can contribute as a housing option.
- Incorporated as a non-profit and established a Board of Directors.
- Worked with a builder and designer on blueprints for safe tiny homes.
- Received a commitment from a charitable organization to provide tax receipts for the project.
- Recruited over 65 volunteers and received unsolicited commitments for in- kind donations by many Guelph-based manufacturers and businesses.

- Arrived at an agreement in principle with Royal City Mission to support the coordination of services with Guelph-based health and social service providers.
- Met with the City of Guelph and The County of Wellington officials.
- Gained support from many key social service agencies that provide services to the people we are trying to house.
- Secured an ongoing commitment from the same social services to continue to provide services at the Guelph Tiny Home

#### SERVICE PROVISION FRAMEWORK

#### Begin with Shelter

# SUPPORT REQUIRED FROM THE CITY OF GUELPH:

1. Support from the City of Guelph in the form of municipal land that is serviced and close to amenities and/or transportation.

2. Designation of the project as a "Public Use" in order to fastrack zoning approvals so we can have homes ready for this winter.

3. In-kind services (infrastructure, garbage pick-up, bus connection) and permitting assistance to enable building to start ASAP with providing homes to those who are experiencing homelessness.

4. Financial support to be discussed.



# SUPPORT REQUIRED FROM THE COUNTY OF WELLINGTON:

- 1. Integration of the Guelph Tiny Homes Project with the County's "By-Name List".
- 2. Similarly to Kitchener-Waterloo projects, that the County facilitate that the ODSP and OW shelter allowance from residents can be used to support the delivery of the Guelph Tiny Homes Project.
- 3. That the Guelph Tiny Homes Project is integrated in the County's housing continuum pipeline. Integration will ensure an exit strategy for residents.
