Crime

Crime Unit

The Crime Unit found itself extremely busy with reports of Sexual Assaults and Child abuse cases that were investigated jointly with Wellington County Family and Child Services in the month of June.

A Sexual Assault charge was laid on a male that was employed by a long-term care home; a person was charged with six counts of Sexual Assault involving a person in authority sexually assaulting a young person and another person was charged with sexually assaulting a young person and failure to comply, as the person was on sexual offence charges previously.

A member from the unit attended Minto Pride in the park and represented the OPP. Additionally, the crime unit oversaw the investigation into a potentially hate motivated mischief regarding the damaged pride decorations.

The Wellington Crime Unit had numerous members recognized for an OPP Accolade Award. This is a prestigious award in which members attended General Headquarters in Orillia to receive. The award was in reference to the Lucas Shortreed Investigation. The award recognized the team for exceptional performance in conducting or supporting an investigation. The investigative Team consisted of members from when the incident initially began back in 2008 and included the team up until the arrest in 2022. This is a well-deserved accomplishment for the Wellington County members that were dedicated to the conclusion of this investigation.



As well, the Unit began an investigation on April 30th, 2024, into an unknown offender that had sexually assaulted a victim from a retail location in the Town of Fergus. Through the investigation, the male was identified, arrested, charged and issued a court date.

Apart from criminal investigations, training remains an important priority for members of the Wellington Crime Unit. A member of the Unit attended Open-Source training which allows the member to conduct investigative online internet queries as a tool that can be utilized to obtain evidence resulting in criminal prosecutions.

Members attended various training presentations and courses, topics included cryptocurrency, search warrant writing and 2SLGBTQIA+ Awareness training.

A major development in a Criminal Intelligence Branch (CIB) case where the extension of hard work and perseverance was key to identifying the deceased party. Wellington Crime Unit have determined the identity of a female that was found near Rockwood 19 years ago using investigative genetic genealogy.

On August 28th, 2005, a pedestrian had discovered human remains while walking in a wooded picnic/rest area off Highway 7 between Rockwood and Guelph. This is when the initial investigation began and was led by the OPP CIB, with the support from the Wellington County OPP, the Office of the Chief Coroner and the Ontario Forensic Pathology Service.

The remains were identified as a female, and it was believed that she was dragged a short distance into a wooded area approximately one month prior to the discovery. A “Woods” brand sleeping bag covered the deceased, who was wearing clothes purchased in the Montreal area. Though the cause of death remains undetermined, investigators have deemed her death suspicious.

Further examination determined that, prior to her death, she had experienced a broken left cheek, nose and left eye socket that had healed. As a result of these injuries, the deceased wore a two-tooth, partial plate on her upper teeth.

In 2022, CIB investigators submitted the case for IGG use in an attempt to determine her identity. In April 2024, a presumptive identification was established and used to locate living family members. A family member’s DNA was used to confirm that the deceased female was Tammy Eileen PENNER of Chilliwack, British Columbia.

Tammy, who was 41 years of age at the time of her disappearance, was reported missing to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on February 7th, 2005. She had been residing in Chilliwack and Abbotsford, British Columbia prior to her disappearance. Investigators believe someone had contact with her during her journey from British Columbia to Ontario.

Community Street Crime Unit

June was welcomed in with D/C Schneider joining the Community Street Crime Unit (CSCU) on a Temporary Assignment. Schneider brings with him a wealth of frontline knowledge from working in both Perth and Wellington County. The CSCU looks forward to working with D/C Schneider and developing his investigative skills.

As part of our commitment to continuous learning, CSCU Members attended various training course and workshops within West Region. The officers bring back knowledge they can share with front line, and it has provided them with additional tools to utilize during their investigations.

In June, an officer with the Wellington County Traffic Unit was patrolling in Center Wellington and located an impaired driver. A search was completed of the individual and a firearm, cocaine and a large quantity of currency was located. Officers completed a further search of the vehicle and found a significant amount of cocaine. The individual was charged with a number of offences and held for bail. Members of The Traffic Unit, D Platoon and CSCU worked together to bring this investigation to a successful conclusion.

The CSCU solved a stolen vehicle occurrence with the assistance of DNA evidence. CSCU used DNA recovered at a scene to identify and charge an individual responsible for stealing an ATV in North Wellington.

In June frontline officers conducting routine patrols in North Wellington and observed suspicious activity. After a short investigation officers arrested an individual for possession for the purpose of trafficking methamphetamine. CSCU assisted with the processing of a significant seizure of methamphetamine as a result of the arrest. This had a large community impact on the North Wellington community.

In July CSCU Assisted PJFCET with a substantial cannabis act investigation. Several search warrants were executed in the Niagara area. A substantial amount of cannabis marihuana and cannabis marihuana products were seized. Several individuals were arrested and charged as a result.

CSCU investigated a break and enter to a business in Center Wellington. Four suspects broke into a business and took several thousand dollars' worth of merchandise and caused damage to the building. CSCU worked with a neighboring police service to identify the individuals responsible. CSCU wrote several warrants to seize clothing and retrieve evidence. Several suspects were charged in relation to the break and enter.

CSCU began a drug related investigation in North Wellington. CSCU identified the person responsible and formed grounds for their arrest. A North Wellington resident was arrested and found in possession of Fentanyl and methamphetamine. The quantity of drugs was consistent with personal use. The accused was charged for breaching their conditions.

In August, CSCU conducted a targeted traffic stop followed by a search warrant execution in relation to a 5-month trafficking investigation. CSCU identified a person who was trafficking drugs in Center and North Wellington. As a result of the investigation, three individuals were charged with numerous offences

related to drug trafficking and possession of weapons. This investigation stemmed from a death related to a drug overdose. This investigation will have a major community impact.

The CSCU assisted neighboring CSCU units with search warrant executions and investigations as part of the ongoing commitment to public safety and reducing harm in our communities.

The Wellington CSCU continues to prioritize local crime trends, the opioid crises and targeting local people identified in property thefts. CSCU members are committed to continuous learning and are attending training when time permits. CSCU has developed local training, mentoring initiatives for front line members to promote officer safety and enhance their local knowledge on the current drug and property crimes trends in the area.

Enhanced Enforcement Program

Enhanced Enforcement is a focused traffic safety initiative which areas of concern are identified through various means and police conduct education and charge drivers who fail to follow the rules of the road. The goal is to reduce safety issues through visibility, presence, and enforcement.

Traffic Management Unit - Administration

Members of Wellington County OPP Detachment participated in the Canada Safe Boating Week as well as the Canada Road Safety Week. Many hours were patrolled on the various waterways resulting in several warnings issued for minor infractions. One operator, however, was educated with an offence notice for open alcohol on a vessel.

On the highways, Wellington County members worked extremely hard keeping the motoring public safe and the results are self-explanatory.

Between June 1st and August 31st members of the Wellington County Traffic Unit issued a total of 2832 Provincial Offence notices (PON) and warnings. (1638 PON's and 1194 warnings) During this same time, the entire Wellington County Detachment (including TMU) issued a total of 2380 PONs and 1735 warnings.

Members of the Wellington Detachment conducted 195 RIDE spot checks.

Wellington County OPP participated in several Long Weekend Campaigns during the summer.

Canada Day Long Weekend – 168 PONs with a further 102 warnings.

Civic Day Long Weekend – 95 PONs with a further 53 warnings.

Labour Day – 245 PONs issued with a further 120 warnings.

Wellington County Detachment investigated a total of 449 motor vehicle collisions.

PC Horton has accepted a position with a Provincial Highway Enforcement Team and will be leaving Wellington County. As a result, PC Paolo Grassi will be joining the TMU in November. Further, PC Hugh Brennan and PC Brad Griffin have both recently joined the unit and bring with them a wealth of knowledge in traffic safety.

PC Tucker Campbell successfully completed the Level 1 basic motorcycle training course in June and is now an active rider within Wellington County.

During the weekend of August 23rd, Sgt Driscoll assisted with a motorcycle escort for the Canada's 911 Ride. Approximately two hundred motorcycles were escorted through Wellington North with a stop at the Arthur Arena. Several community members attended during the short 1 hour stop. The foundation has been in operation for 19 years and has raised more than \$1 million. The foundation was dedicated to honoring and preserving the legacy of fallen emergency responders – police, fire, and EMS, who made the ultimate sacrifice in the line of duty.

Community Response Unit / Offender Management & Apprehension Program:

Offender Management & Apprehension Program

The members of the Community Response Unit continue facilitating the Offender Management & Apprehension Program. From January 1, 2024 – August 31, 2024, warrants: 189 have been executed by Wellington County OPP. In August, there were twenty bail condition compliance checks on those in the community. There remain 237 active warrants.

Community Engagement

Wellington County Community Response Unit conducted several bike patrols in the Elora Gorge Conservation area along with the Elora Quarry due to high tourist traffic and issues with trespassing.



Wellington County Community Response Unit were able to do marine patrols on Belwood Lake, Conestoga Lake and Guelph Lake in August issuing several Provincial Offence notices to several operators for safety equipment issues. This gloomy day CRU members along with Staff Sergeant Medeiros made patrols of Belwood lake.



On August 9th to the 11th Wellington County Community Response Unit and Paid Duty officers assisted with the parade and attended the Fergus Scottish Festival and Highland Games in Fergus. On the Saturday, the event had a large influx of visitors causing a traffic backlog. A debrief is expected in October and suggestions will be shared to resolve these issues for next year for the 80th Anniversary.

Hillsburgh Family Fun Day was on August 17th, OPP Auxiliaries members attended, were present for the public and even helped with take down.

Elora RiverFest August 16th -18th was held at Bissell Park. Unfortunately, for event organizers the deluge of rain and water runoff dampened the spirit of the event. OPP Paid duty members were on scene with the CRU acting supervisor involved with the Walk-Through and OPP Operations Plan.

Our Community Services Officers attended a Wellington North Day Camp in Arthur to provide some insight into policing and specific equipment officers' use. Special thanks to the counsellors for taking some action shots and providing contact information for parental consent.

Safe Communities Wellington County

During the months of June, July, and August, Safe Communities Wellington County concentrated on key safety themes and initiatives to promote public awareness and injury prevention.

National Injury Prevention Day:

- Event: A dedicated booth was set up at the Drayton Fire Hall on July 5, 2024.
- Purpose: To raise awareness about injury prevention strategies and provide community members with essential safety information.

Social Media and Radio Campaigns:

- Water Safety: Emphasized the importance of safety in open bodies of water around the Grand River watershed. This campaign aimed to educate the public on preventing water-related accidents.
- Aggressive Driving: Addressed the issue of aggressive driving, particularly on the Highway 6 corridor. Efforts included promoting safer driving habits and awareness of the dangers of aggressive driving.
- Sharing the Road: Focused on the safe interaction between motorists, farm equipment, and cyclists. Campaigns highlighted the need for mutual respect and caution on the roads.
- Opioid Awareness Day: Concluded the summer with a focus on opioid awareness at the end of August. This initiative aimed to inform the public about opioid risks and resources available for assistance.

The activities carried out over these three months were designed to enhance community safety and raise awareness on critical issues. Safe Communities Wellington County remains committed to fostering a safer environment through continued education and outreach.

Auxiliary Unit members participated in both regular patrols as well as marine patrols throughout the summer. We had members assist with ERT training as well as a bike rodeo in Moorefield and a car show in Fergus. We also teamed up with the Cambridge HSD Auxiliary Unit to participate in an exotic car show in Guelph. PC Draves and Auxiliary Staff Sergeant Swan attended a West Region Auxiliary Unit Commander and Liaison Summit in London. This opportunity allowed them to connect with other Auxiliary Unit personnel in person, as well as share ideas and concerns with members of the Auxiliary Program Office.

Auxiliary Unit Members at the Mount Forest Fireworks festival had the opportunity to take one of the newest cruisers in Wellington and enter it in both the car show on Saturday and the Touch a Truck event on Sunday to build community relations. At Hillside, Auxiliary members did both foot patrol duties as well as assisting in Marine Patrols. Auxiliary members also assisted with showing off a cruiser and doing a safety talk for children's day camps in Harriston and Palmerston.

A highlight for the unit this summer was the opportunity to present Auxiliary Constable Natalie Burek with the 2023 Kruger Family Award for excellence in Auxiliary Policing. Natalie has put in numerous

hours for the unit. She was mainly responsible for organizing a child car seat certification clinic for Auxiliary members. For the first time in many years, we now have some members qualified to perform child car seat inspections. Natalie has also spent a lot of time helping to coach and mentor new members to the unit.

Congratulations to Auxiliary Sergeant Stephen Jamieson for his ongoing service to the County of Wellington, the Ontario Provincial Police, and the Province of Ontario.

Crime Stoppers

June started on a high note as Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington (CSGW) was awarded five Ontario Association of Crime Stoppers honours at the June 1st Annual General Meeting and Conference, which was virtual. Once the awards are in hand, CSGW will promote these accomplishments through social media, website, and traditional media.

The final totals are in for the May Mulch Sales. Guelph raised \$1,776 and Mount Forest raised \$3,461. These values would not have been possible without the generous support of JL's Home Hardware and Young's Home Hardware.

Requests for presentations normally drop off in the summer months. This allows the Program Coordinator to review the current presentations and update content where needed, as well as develop any new messaging that may be in demand. Such is the case with Cyber Safety. Both Upper Grand District School Board and Wellington Catholic District School Board have reviewed and approved

secondary school messaging on this topic and have requested a modified version for elementary schools.

CSGW developed an agriculture themed presentation at the request of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture and delivered the message virtually in a “Lunch and Learn” format. Prior to the presentation there were requests for interviews from the OFA internal publication as well as Better Farming magazine which engaged a new audience for the program.

Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington’s Road Sign campaign continues with additional signs being converted to the new “Say It Here” format in the City of Guelph. A brand-new location just west of Palmerston was made possible with support from the Palmerston Lions Club. Additional locations are available in the Town of Minto as well as Erin and Rockwood. As always, thanks and appreciation go to the County of Wellington Public Works team who install these signs after approving the locations.

Regular media engagement, as permitted by the summer schedule, continued including Wightman TV Community Channel 6 tapings for “What’s On Minto” and “What’s On Mount Forest”. Radio visits with Swap Talk on The Grand at 101 and 88.7 The River.

CSGW partnered with Guelph United F.C. for a special community engagement event on August 5th. The men’s and women’s teams had a double-header and gave CSGW the opportunity to hold a 50/50 draw as well as have an info tent with information on Crime Stoppers.

Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington is working with Wellington Catholic District School Board and Upper Grand District School Board to develop and deliver a Cyber Safety message for Elementary School students. The CS (Cyber Safety) Presentation will be modified for a shorter presentation time and with age-appropriate language. As with all CSGW presentations, this information will be approved for implementation by the respective school boards. The secondary school version has already been approved. The launch of this new initiative will take place once the Boards have signed off on the elementary version.

In a similar vein, CSGW social media is focusing on back-to-school safety with regards to not posting detailed information about your child’s likes/school etc. as this information is used by predators to engage children. We are also reminding parents to do “Device Checks,” so they are aware of who their child is engaging with.

Additionally, Shredding Event dates are quickly approaching with Mount Forest on September 14th and Guelph on September 28th. For more information go to www.csgw.tips or our social media accounts on Facebook, X/Twitter, Instagram, and LinkedIn.

CSGW has made a concerted effort to ensure consistency with marketing/branding by requesting partners use www.csgw.tips as the URL for the program and reminding that the name of the organization is “Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington” and not “Guelph Wellington Crime Stoppers.” The current CSGW logo was updated a number of years ago, but periodically we see the old version popping up. 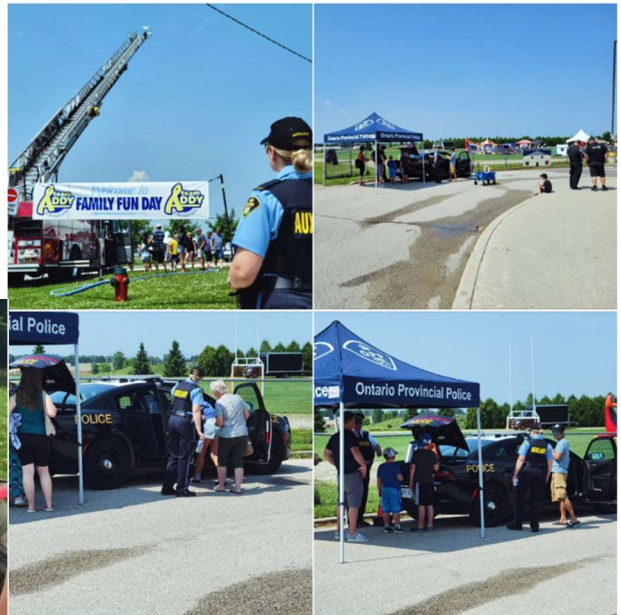

Wellington County Court Bureau summer highlights:

- Improving procedures for new charges that are being laid by way of Criminal Code Summons with consideration being given to the different tasks involved, as well as the service and tracking of each Summons.
- Provided clarification and/or educating officers who are required to attend POA Part I and Part III trials as to their responsibilities and expectations.
- Reviewed responsibilities of the local Crown and Wellington OPP in terms of timely disclosure of reports and evidence and how to mitigate any late submissions.
- Provided direction for officers regarding recent Crown requests for applications to be submitted by officers for victims using testimonial aids during trial.
- Improving procedures for tracking incoming and completed warrants and for monitoring any action taken on determining a wanted person's whereabouts.
- Compiled information on step-by-step court procedures for new officers to Wellington to assist them in understanding the process of submitting POA/Criminal Code charges, bail checklists, creating Case Files, Case Law, etc.
- Provided assistance for developing a new process for officers giving input to Wellness Court referrals. The Crown had been previously seeking officer input into our observations and recommendations for additional resources for accused persons with mental health needs.
- Seeking ways to improve communication with Probation and Parole by providing their office with information of any contact our officers have with offenders during calls for service, wellness checks, new charges being laid, etc.
- Establishing improved relationship with the Offender Transport Unit by having a greater awareness of their expanding responsibilities and providing opportunities for their members to assist further at the Detachment level.

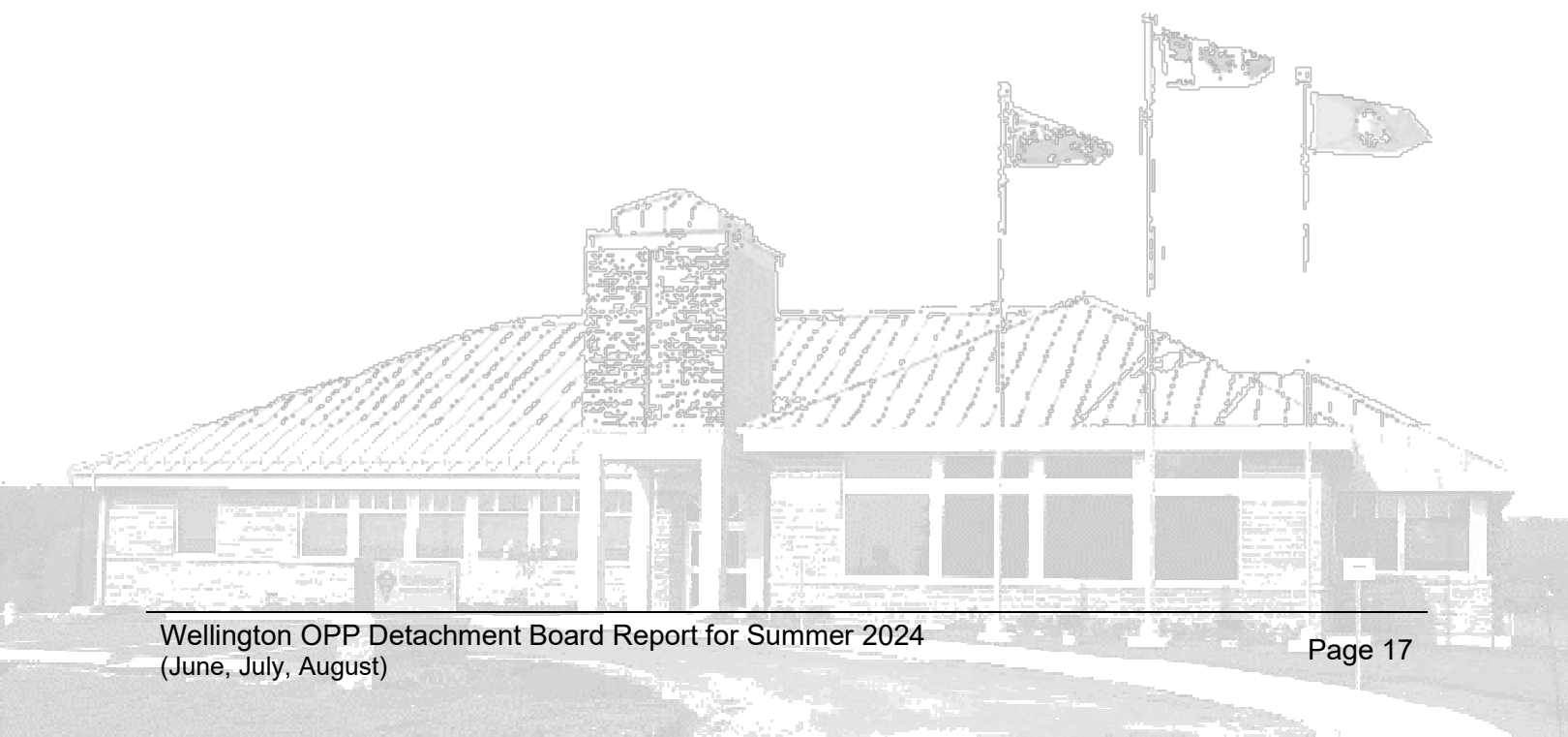

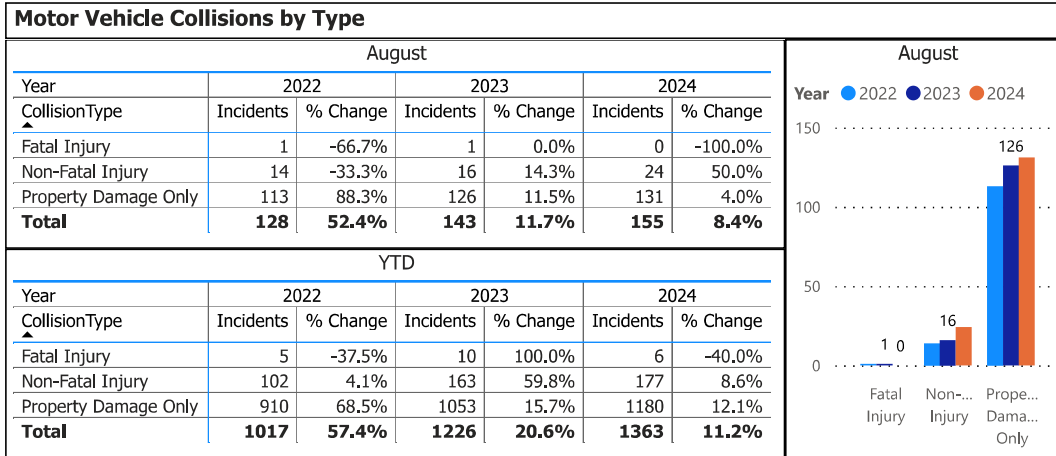
Report Summary
