Crime

Crime Unit

Supervisor: Acting Detective Sergeant, Tyler Cowie

In the month of March, the Wellington County OPP Crime Unit received benchmark occurrence notifications for a number of sexual related offences, frauds and a break and enter.

On March 19th, 2025, an arrest was made in connection to a September 2023 death investigation where a 32-year-old man was found dead in a car parked alongside the road in Puslinch. A woman was arrested and charged by the Wellington County OPP Crime Unit for indignity to a dead body and theft under \$5000.

Crime Unit members also attended a West Region Crime Conference at the Ontario Police College on March 20th & 21st. Informative presentations were provided by the Forensic Interview Team, Criminal Investigation Branch, the Cyber Enabled Fraud Team, the Cybercrime Investigations Team and the Provincial Asset Forfeiture Unit. There were also several interesting and valuable case studies that were presented on investigations that occurred throughout West Region including Wellington County.



Community Street Crime Unit

Wellington County Community Street Crime Unit (CSCU) continues to support the Major Crime Unit and frontline investigations where possible.

CSCU executed a search warrant at a residence in Erin Township in relation to Bell Canada Line thefts. CSCU located a large quantity of stolen copper wire which came from Bell Canada phone lines. The phone lines had been cut down and stolen from various locations in Wellington County. The group of individuals were actively cutting down Bell Canada phone and internet lines to strip for copper. As a result, five people were charged with mischief and theft related charges. These thefts are interrupting Bell Canada service throughout Wellington County.

CSCU conducted an online investigation in relation to stolen Hockey equipment being sold on Facebook Market Place. The hockey equipment was stolen from the Palmerston arena in 2022. As a result of the investigation a Perth County person has been charged with possession of property obtained by crime.

Wellington CSCU continues to prioritize local crime trends, the opioid crises and targeting local people identified in property thefts. CSCU members are committed to continuous learning and are attending training when time permits. CSCU has developed local training, mentoring initiatives for front line members to promote officer safety and enhance their local knowledge on the current drug and property crimes trends in the area.

Enhanced Enforcement Program

Enhanced Enforcement is a focused traffic safety initiative which areas of concern are identified through various means and police conduct education and charge drivers who fail to follow the rules of the road. The goal is to reduce safety issues through visibility, presence, and enforcement.

Enhanced Enforcement protocols were rolled out on November 14, 2023. The following locations and charges are from March 2025.

Traffic Management Unit - Administration

Snowmobile patrols have concluded for the season. Officers performed a total of 93 hours of snowmobile patrol amounting to 2,168 kms travelled. This resulted in 1,185 MSVs checked for compliance, 71 charges and 83 Warnings under the MSVA, TPA and LLCA.

Members of the Wellington Detachment conducted over 48 RIDE spot checks across the County.

Members issued a total of 691 Provincial Offence Notices as well as an additional 409 warnings.

Wellington County Detachment investigated a total of 107 motor vehicle collisions. There was 1 fatal collision on March 6th that was weather related.

Community Response Unit / Offender Management & Apprehension Program:

Offender Management & Apprehension Program

The members of the Community Response Unit continue facilitating the Offender Management & Apprehension Program.

Currently, there are 21 warrants classified as 'Priority Warrants'. Further, each Priority Offender has been actioned to determine their whereabouts. Most priority offenders have fled out of jurisdiction, interprovincially and internationally. Coordination to arrest those offenders is taking place where feasible. Provincial Support Services, including the Bail Support Team are actively engaged and assisting with facilitating arrests of persons outside our area.

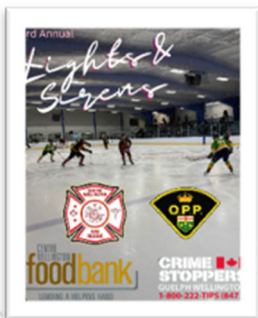

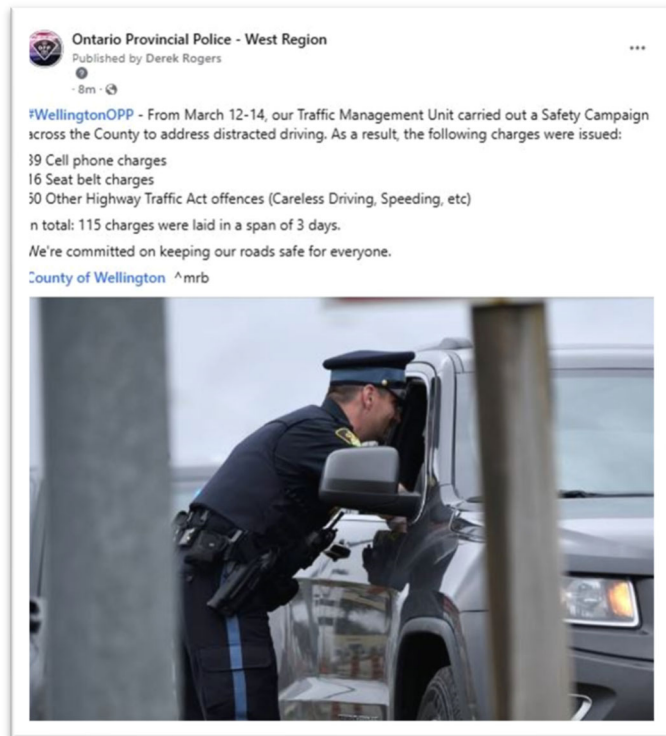
Community Safety and Services

Several scenarios relevant to our Auxiliary duties were included in the training and were the source of some good discussion. We have also started our round of annual block training which will carry on through April.

We have been informed that we have two new members who will be joining the unit in April. We had two members attend the Lights and Sirens charity hockey game in a support role. We had one member successfully pass the swim test to allow them to participate in Marine duties coming up this summer.

We continue to participate in general patrol duties with regular members.

Safe Communities Wellington County

Safe Communities has been actively engaged in multiple initiatives and events, demonstrating a strong commitment to community safety and well-being. Below is a summary of the key activities completed recently:

1. Community Safety and Well-Being Plan:

- Safe Communities successfully dedicated time and resources to completing the Community Safety and Well-Being Plan, setting a robust framework for ongoing safety initiatives.

2. Annual Pancake Breakfast:

- The annual pancake breakfast, hosted by the Wellington County Home and Farm Safety Association, was a great success.
- The event provided a platform to engage with families on essential topics:
 - Discussed farmers' mental health.
 - Educated children on the importance of wearing helmets while bike riding.

3. Lights and Sirens Event:

- Safe Communities participated in the Lights and Sirens event.
- Key topics discussed with families included:
 - Poison prevention.
 - Cyber safety.

4. Media Outreach:

- Focused efforts on promoting poison prevention through social media and radio channels, reinforcing the critical safety message to a broader audience.

Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington (CSGW)

Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington is once again working with The Grandway Event Centre for Trivia Night on April 4th. From 6:30pm to 9:00pm teams of two or four people can challenge themselves and each other to see who reigns supreme on a variety of trivia topics. Wellington County OPP, Centre Wellington Fire Rescue and Guelph Police Service have all been encouraged to enter teams for a friendly competition. The Cyber Safety Presentation continues to be the priority for CSGW engagement. Bookings have been closed for the school year as all available time slots have been claimed. There will be discussions with the two school boards around future presentations and content updates.

Lights & Sirens was held March 22nd at the Jefferson Arena in Elora. Once again Wellington County OPP and Centre Wellington Fire Rescue faced off after a family skate, and the winners were Centre Wellington Food Bank and CSGW. CSGW held a 50/50 draw and presented information for fans. A total of \$862 was raised and 171 pounds of food was donated. Sincere thanks go out to the players who gave their time.

- During the month of March, members of the Court Bureau have been assisting the Economic Crime and Corruption Unit, involving one of their fraud investigations that occurred in multiple jurisdictions throughout the province. Three separate incidents involving fraudulent bank transactions. A Judge's Order was successfully obtained, and the accused was brought before the courts to answer to the charges.

Report Summary

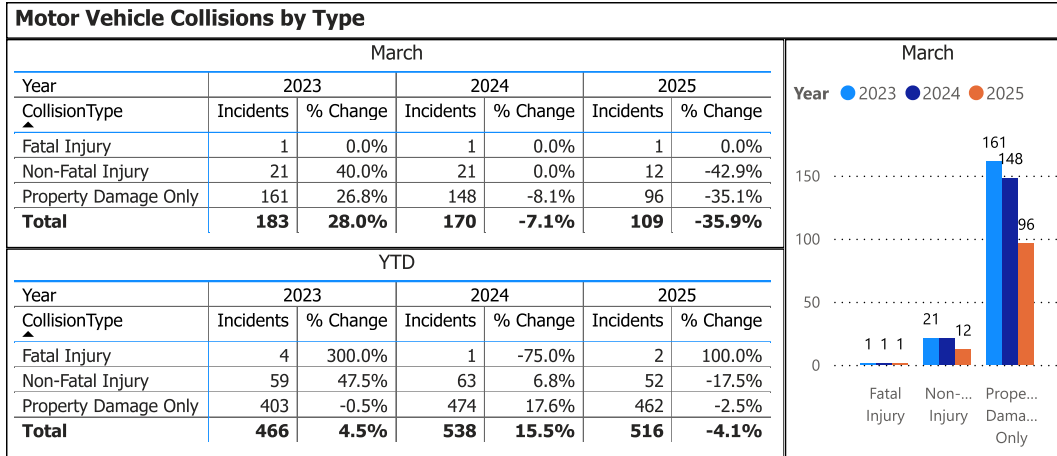
