## Crime

---

### Crime Unit

Supervisor: Acting Detective Sergeant, Tyler Cowie

May turned out to be a busy and demanding month for the Wellington County Crime Unit. A death investigation from an incident that occurred in Wellington County is currently being led by the OPP's Criminal Investigations Branch (CIB). The Wellington County Crime Unit has received valuable and appreciated assistance from detectives in Norfolk County, Huron County, Perth County, Oxford County, South Bruce, Grey-Bruce and the West Region, Regional Support Team. This investigation is active and ongoing.

Training opportunities continued into May with members attending Powercase training and the Criminal Investigative Techniques course.

The Wellington County Crime Unit has begun the process to fill a vacant position within the unit. Applications were received and interviews will be conducted the week of June 9<sup>th</sup> with the successful applicant expected to start in the Crime Unit immediately.

## **Community Street Crime Unit**

The Wellington County Street Crime Unit (CSCU) continues to support the Crime Unit and frontline investigations where possible. Members mentored a front-line constable with the drafting of a production order related to a fraud investigation, assisted front line members with processing exhibits seized from a traffic stop where a significant quantity of schedule I substances were seized and assisted the Wellington County Crime Unit with an ongoing death investigation.

Members assisted the provincial Auto Theft and Towing team by executing one of many search warrants related to the theft and re-vin of motor vehicles spanning across the province, including Wellington County.

Wellington County CSCU assisted the Organized Crime Enforcement Bureau with multiple search warrants being executed simultaneously across the province.

Wellington County CSCU executed a search warrant related to a multi-jurisdictional drug trafficking ring, assisted Grey/Bruce OPP with a search warrant that resulted in guns, drugs, and cash being seized and executed two search warrants related to the supply of cocaine into Centre Wellington. Wellington County CSCU drafted a search warrant for a vehicle that resulted a schedule I seizure and propelled a parallel investigation.

In May, a CSCU member completed the mobile surveillance course.

### Traffic Management Unit - Administration

Marine members attended the Belwood Lake fish derby on May 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup>. OPP and MNR conducted a joint patrol on the OPP Vessel. Approximately 50 vessels were checked resulting in one life jacket ticket being issued along with two fishing licence violation tickets and 12 other small vessel infraction warnings.

Members of the Wellington Detachment conducted 48 RIDE spot checks across the County.

Members of the Wellington Detachment issued a total of 735 Provincial Offence Notices as well as an additional 473 warnings.

Wellington County Detachment investigated a total of 115 motor vehicle collisions. There were no fatal collisions in the month of May.

TMU members will be participating in a Commercial Motor Vehicle blitz on June 16<sup>th</sup>, partnering with the MTO and several other municipal police services.

### Community Response Unit / Offender Management & Apprehension Program:

#### Offender Management & Apprehension Program

The members of the Community Response Unit continue facilitating the Offender Management & Apprehension Program.

At present, several warrants have been designated as Priority Warrants. New warrants continue to be generated and in the process of being actioned. All identified priority offenders have been actioned for location efforts. The majority of these individuals have fled the jurisdiction, including interprovincial and international locations. Where feasible, coordination efforts are underway to facilitate their arrest. Provincial Support Services, including the Bail Support Team, remain actively engaged in assisting with the apprehension of offenders outside the region.

### Community Safety and Services (CSS)

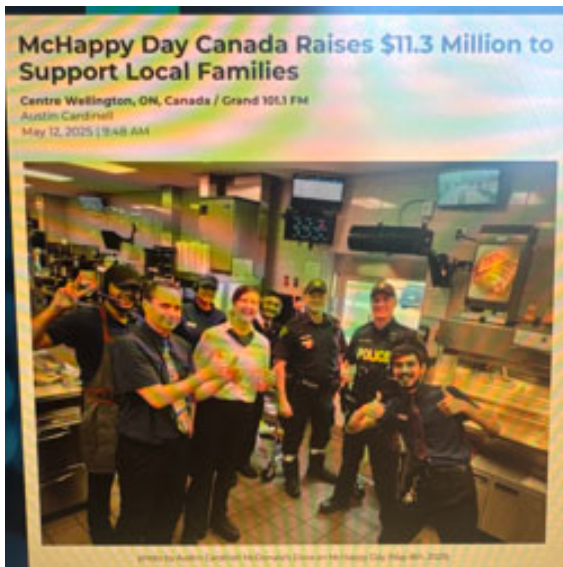

## Auxiliary Unit

A highlight of our monthly training was a visit from the Detachment Command Staff who thanked the unit for their service and provided some food in recognition of 65 years of the Auxiliary program. Several members were recognized for five or more years of service with the program. Inspector Medeiros presented these members with a certificate as well as a Wellington County challenge coin. We also shared a note a member of the public had passed along to the Detachment Commander regarding a positive interaction they had at the Drayton Farm Show with one of our Auxiliary Constables.

We had members attend several community events this month. Among these events were bike rodeos in Arkell, Fergus and Puslinch, fire department open houses in Erin and Rockwood, and community events in Mapleton and Aberfoyle. At the fire department open house in Rockwood the unit ran a child car seat inspection clinic with seven inspections completed. We were also invited to attend the Centre Wellington Food Bank's awards evening where we were presented with a plaque recognizing our participation in the "stuff a cruiser" food drives over the past year. Jackie Andrews from the food bank noted that these "stuff a cruiser" events have consistently been one of the top sources of donations for the food bank for several years. Members also continued to support the detachment through both vehicle and marine patrol duties.

## Safe Communities Wellington County

Safe Communities Wellington County continued its commitment to promoting safety and well-being across the region through a range of community initiatives and collaborative efforts.

Key activities included:

- Road Safety Advocacy: We delegated the Wellington County Roads Committee to explore and discuss new road safety strategies. These included a discussion about E-Scooters on Wellington County Roads as well as the implementation of Gateway pavement markings aimed at reducing vehicle speed when entering municipalities.
- Community Engagement: Safe Communities Wellington County actively participated in two Safe Kids Days, hosted by the Town of Minto and the Mapleton Safe Communities Committee. In

Minto, we showcased plasma cars and BAC goggles to engage participants in learning about the dangers of impaired driving due to alcohol, drugs, or fatigue.

- Public Outreach: Our team joined the Fergus Lions Home and Leisure Show for a fun and safety-focused three-day event. We distributed 50 safety scavenger hunts to families, helping to raise awareness around various safety topics in an interactive and engaging way.

These efforts reflect our ongoing dedication to creating a safer community for all residents of Wellington County.

### **Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington (CSGW)**

Crime Stoppers Guelph Wellington (CSGW) hosted the Southwest Zone meeting for programs from Owen Sound to Haldimand Norfolk to Windsor at the Ariss Valley Golf Course on May 1<sup>st</sup>. The meeting was well attended by CSGW representatives and served as a primer for programs planning to attend the Ontario Association of Crime Stoppers conference in North Bay in June.

May is always Mulch Month, and CSGW held an in-person fundraiser at Young's Home Hardware in Mount Forest on May 10<sup>th</sup>. All sales from this event are being donated to CSGW. JL's Home Hardware had a month-long promotion at their three locations, where \$1 sold from every bag of mulch is donated to CSGW. The totals of these events will be shared next month. CSGW Board members also had a table at the Wellington Street location on May 3<sup>rd</sup> to increase awareness and answer questions about the program.

Cyber Safety Presentations continue to take priority on the Program Coordinator's calendar. These presentations are proving to be important and timely for students and staff. There are many misconceptions among youth about online scams, sextortion, Child Pornography, and their risk with it comes to these harms. CSGW is discussing with UGDSB and WCDSB how the campaign moves forward for the 2025-26 school year.

CSGW is working with Guelph Police Service, Victim Services Wellington, Guelph Wellington Women In Crisis and local video producer Tivoli Films to create an impactful video on Human Trafficking awareness in the City of Guelph. This video will be launched the first week of June, in concert with a multi-agency Human Trafficking campaign to offer increased rewards for charges and arrests in Human Trafficking. Crime Stoppers programs in Durham Region, Guelph Wellington, Halton, Waterloo, and Niagara are partnering, thanks to the leadership of Crime Stoppers of Halton Region.

The campaign will run from June to the end of August, capitalizing on the summer holiday season.

## Court

Wellington County Court Bureau highlights:

- Reviewed current practice of third-party records disclosure and implemented changes in keeping with provincial direction and Crown consultation.
- Efforts made to clarify responsibilities with POA prosecutions and our officers in obtaining “Statutory Declarations” from Insurance Companies when some of our “No Insurance” charges are being laid that will hopefully streamline evidence disclosure.
- Education and additional upcoming training dates provided to members for electronic submission and “clipping” of audio/video files with evidentiary value.
- Direction provided to court bureau members with regards to the practice of email service of documents in certain cases.
- Court Bureau supervisor attended the Provincial Police Court Managers (OAPCM) conference with other stakeholders (members from other Police jurisdictions, Ministry of Attorney General (Court Services and Criminal Law Divisions, Business Continuity and Emergency Management), members from Ministry of Solicitor General, etc.) to discuss court efficiencies and court security. Topics included new legislation, emergency management, digital transformation of courts, and the use of “Artificial Intelligence” in policing.
