

Cinnamon Sugar Snowflakes

These delicious (and beautiful) edible snowflakes have only 4 ingredients and are ready to eat in 10 minutes. Warm up inside while it flurries outside
– **THESE GO GREAT WITH HOT COCOA!**



INGREDIENTS

- Tortillas
- Cinnamon
- White sugar
- Melted butter

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Microwave your tortillas for around 10 seconds – this softens them and prevents rips.
2. Fold a tortilla in half, and then in half again, and cut it as if you were making a paper snowflake.
3. Put your tortillas on a baking sheet and brush them with the melted butter.
4. Sprinkle your snowflakes with cinnamon and sugar.
5. Bake your snowflakes at 350 °F for 5 – 10 minutes (depending on how crispy you'd like them to be). Let them cool and enjoy!

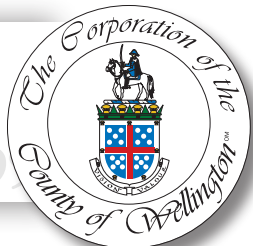

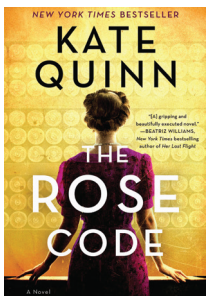

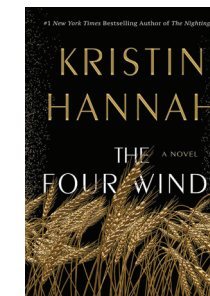
