As we are now in the middle of winter, please exercise care and caution while driving in adverse weather and road conditions. As the saying goes, "if you see snow, go slow."

#### 2021 Festive R.I.D.E

On November 11, 2021 the joint Wellington County OPP/Guelph Police Service Annual Festive RIDE Kick-Off Event was held. The 2021 Festive RIDE Initiative runs from November 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021 to January 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2021.

R.I.D.E checkpoints save lives year after year by taking impaired drivers off our roadways and holding them accountable for their actions that place the lives of others at risk. But that risk that is present to our communities goes well beyond the Festive R.I.D.E dates. We would be naïve to think that people driving on our roadways while impaired was not a daily occurrence. Hence, the importance for all officers to conduct regular R.I.D.E spot checks each and every shift. It sends a message to the community and those that choose to drive while impaired that we care about our community and will be relentless in doing everything possible to eradicate impaired driving.

As a result of the Festive R.I.D.E Program and our relentless pursuit to end impaired driving, Wellington County OPP officers conducted 57 R.I.D.E checkpoints resulting in three individuals receiving a warn range suspension and 12 people being charged with impaired, over 80 mgs or refusal. There was a total of 36 occurrences involving charges under the Criminal Code of Canada or some involvement in relation to alcohol and driving.


