Subject: Arthur Garage - Project Update

Background:

This information report provides the Committee a project update and concept plans for the new Arthur Garage.

The zoning for the project was approved by Wellington North Council at their meeting on May 9, 2022. The County took possession of the property located at 7970 Wellington Road 12 on November 1, 2022. A Holding Zone provision was removed by the Wellington North Council at their meeting of December 19, 2022. A site plan submission has been made to the Township and a building permit application will be required in the future.

Concept plans for this project are attached to this report. The proposed facility consists of office and staff areas in addition to the garage space consisting of six service bays and a wash bay. A salt and sand storage area with a drive thru truck loading zone are part of the building design. The exterior yard space will consist of areas for fueling, brine tanks, material storage, parking, stormwater management and an equipment drive shed. The overall site design includes an allowance for a future emergency services station.

At this time, the proposed general schedule for the project is as follows:

- Project Tender February, 2023
- Project Award April, 2023
- Construction start May, 2023
- Construction completion May, 2024

Significant Weather Event December 23 to 26, 2022

Forecast

- With over 3 days of forecasted high winds (~70-80kph) and snow accumulation, staff anticipated poor visibility and drifting on the roads.
- On Friday December 23, 2022 at around 10:00 am, the County of Wellington declared a Significant Weather Event.
- This marks the first time the County has declared a Significant Weather Event



What is a Significant Weather Event?

 A municipality can declare a Significant Weather Event when a weather hazard is approaching or occurring and has the potential to pose a significant danger to users of roads. This will allow County operations additional time to address the significant weather event and remain incompliance with the Minimum Maintenance Standards regulation (Ontario Regulation 239/02 as amended).



Calls for Assistance

- We had 18 requests from the OPP which included helping a stuck cruiser, a few road closures and a couple of abandoned vehicles on the road.
- We had 7 requests from the Guelph-Wellington Paramedic Service for assistance to get to a location for a EMS call.



Material Usage

From December 22 to 28, we used:

- 2,312 tonnes of sand (Cost approx. \$ 25,000.00)
- 1,396 tonnes of salt (Cost Approx. \$150,000.00)

This is more material than the sand dome at Central can hold.

We also drove a total of 59,392 km.



Hours

As this happened during the holiday's a lot of the time was paid overtime. On overtime time only, there were:

- 1053.5 hours at 1.5
- 203.5 hours at 2.0

Total of 1257 hours

This roughly equals about \$60,000 in overtime pay


